Lower Sixth End of Year Activities Trip

At the end of the academic year, our current Lower Sixth students will have the opportunity to attend our inaugural end of year activities trip. The trip will be for 3 days and 2 nights in Lakeside outdoor pursuits centre in the Lake District. Students will combine a range of wet and dry activities as well as a number of developmental life skills courses delivered by accompanying staff. They will spend time exploring areas such as; managing exam stress, communication, developing a growth mind-set, becoming an attractive applicant to universities and employers, public speaking and financial planning. Some of the proposed outdoor activities include:

HIGH ROPES COURSE

The High Ropes Course offers both an individual and team challenge. It is a fun activity which provides an opportunity to develop communication skills and teamwork as participants navigate round an aerial course. The activity is designed to develop trust and co-operation and improve self-confidence and a sense of achievement.

KAYAKING

Kayaks are single person crafts with a cockpit area for the paddler to sit in. The session take place on Lake Windermere close to the shore to teach basic skills of paddling and steering. The aim of this activity is to develop water confidence whilst providing a personal challenge and promoting group awareness in a fun environment.

NIGHTLINE

Nightline is a high involvement activity requiring the team to negotiate a set course whilst wearing blindfolds. It is an enjoyable activity which is about communication and teamwork along with the experience of being deprived of sight. The aim is to work as a team to develop skills such as trust and responsibility.

SEARCH & RESCUE

The activity involves setting a scenario for the group to solve - this could be recovering missing objects or a missing person. The group needs to learn about search patterns then plan and conduct a search. The aim of this activity is to encourage clear communication and teamwork and to develop map reading skills. To learn about rescue organisation and basic first aid techniques

Lakeside has been specifically chosen for the excellent educational value it provides. In addition, pupils will have plenty of opportunities, in supervised groups, for their own free time to socialise and appreciate the beautiful surroundings. We are offering this exciting trip to the entire year group and we expect that it will become another incredibly successful Sixth Form tradition.



General Election 2019

The College, Sixth Form and Prep School all took to the Polling Stations dotted around the College yesterday and the votes have been counted. Interestingly, in stark contrast to the national vote the College voted for the Labour Party with well over a third of the vote, followed by the Liberal Democrats with the Greens in a close third place.
