Football Success - Samson's Story

St Bede's has blessed me with many sporting opportunities. My schoolboy football experiences this past 12 months have been truly amazing. Last season, Mr Mitchell and Mr Wilson give me my outfield debut as a centre back playing for school. I enjoyed this very much and I feel that it has helped my understanding of football beyond my usual perspective as a goalkeeper.

Earlier this year, I was selected to be part of the ISFA U13 North West regional squad. ISFA is the Independent Schools Football Association and the players are made up of what are considered to be the best Independent schoolboys in the North West. We played against some local professional academies, with the aim of preparing us for a showcase football event at the renowned Shrewsbury School.

At this National Football Festival, we played matches against all of the other regional ISFA squads. The common aim was not only developing us as individual players, but also to allow ISFA to select England squads for further national events. While having the privilege of boarding at Shrewsbury School, I also made some very good friends among the North West ISFA squad. These boys were from other Independent Schools in the North West and boys whom I have previously been competing against.

My performances throughout the festival led to my selection for the ISFA England squad. We played and boarded at the prestigious Harrow School. I was amazed to learn that Harrow school is over 500 years old. I felt so honoured to be there and so inspired on all levels. My room was on a hill overlooking North London and had the perfect view of Wembley Stadium.

At the beginning of this season I was lucky enough to be selected to play for Manchester Schoolboys FA U14 at District Level. I am especially proud of this achievement as this tradition dates back over 100 years. Many players whom I admire, including many from St Bede's, have played for Manchester SFA. My highlight has been a recent win against a very strong Knowsley Schoolboys FA team, played at Liverpool Football Academy. We are currently unbeaten and are top of the ESFA Northwest District League and through to the next round of the GMCSFA Cup.

"I will always be grateful to Mr McGrath for giving me my debut as a goalkeeper in Prep 4, aged 8 and playing two years up at Under 11. It was a 9-0 defeat at Cheadle Hulme School. I may have even scored a couple of those goals, but to be given the start for St Bede's Prep B team was so exciting and my

proudest moment ever. I feel I have come a long way since then. I hope that I can continue improving and developing as a player. "


Careers Talk

We are really grateful to Mrs Dada-Mascoll for giving up her valuable time to give our pupils lots to think about as they start to consider their own career paths.




