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Visiting Artist

On Wednesday 11 March, Prep 6 were lucky enough to spend the day with acclaimed Manchester artist, Justin Eagleton. We have been studying the work of this local artist in recent weeks, particularly looking at his UK city map illustrations which feature in the rooms of a major hotel chain. Justin has enjoyed a diverse career in the art world to date; from prop making for Granada Studios in the early years, to stadium design for FIFA/EA Games and creating specially commissioned portraits of local and international celebrities. One of Justin's most recent accolades was to be chosen to design one of the Manchester Bees - The Hac-BEE-Enda which later sold for charity raising over £20,000. His latest Manchesterthemed piece is an installation at The Printworks and is a digital media homage to the city's rich cultural, social, industrial and political heritage.

Justin engaged the children with interesting and witty reflections on his career path and his early inspirations. He discussed the opportunities offered by modern technology and how it can impact both the creation and marketing of a piece of art. Finally, he wowed everyone with the time-lapse videos of his stunning portrait paintings of some of our local footballing heroes. The children then enjoyed a practical session where they used a range of media, including: newspaper collage, acrylic paint and adding a final flourish of gold leaf (24 carat magic!) to produce a canvas painting based on Justin's latest commission: The Buzz, which recently sold at charity auction for The Christie for £2,500. The finished pieces are simply stunning and will form part of a wider Prep school art gallery display (details to be announced at a later date).

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The opportunity to BEE an artist for the day was relished by each one of the Prep 6 children and staff who took part in Justin's workshops. It was especially relevant for the children to make such a memorable connection with a 'real life' home-grown artist from our rich Mancunian soil. We look forward to inviting Justin back into school to work with both Prep and Senior pupils in the not too distant future.
