On Tuesday we celebrated the Feast of St Bede in style, as the whole College 3-18 assembled in the College playground to enjoy a short service led by Bedian Deacon David Irwin. However, return in style it did, on Tuesday 25 May the Senior netball team travelled to Bromsgrove School for the Sister n Sport Final from 2020. The final was played on outdoor courts against Samuel Whitbread Academy. We did just that and finished the half 32 goals to 10. Changes were made for the 3rd quarter with Riley coming on into the WD position and the very talented Harriet and Savannah moving into defence, we turned a lot of their centre passes and took



charge of the 3rd quarter with the score ending 47-11.

The girls relaxed more in the last quarter and managed to show some lovely through court play from defence to attack. Aoife was on fire in the shooting circle and hardly missed many shots all game and was rightly given player of the match by the organisers. The girls finished the final in style with a 60-13 victory. This was a great way for some of the girls to finish their time at St Bede's, they worked hard throughout the 2020 season, qualifying for the regional netball finals and winning the county tournament. Wonderful Workshop

Our talented dancers had the opportunity to take part in a number of workshops last Friday. Thanks to The Lowry's Centre for Advanced Training, we were treated to sessions with professional contemporary dancer Sophie Moore. As a Manchester girl, she danced at school, taking GCSE and A Level Dance before graduating from Trinity Laban Conservatoire with a First Class degree.

The day started with a technique class for our Upper Fourth dancers, focussing on key skills such as balance and coordination and encouraging them to use feedback to continually improve. They were then inspired to create a small solo piece inspired by different action words before showcasing their work in a final performance.

Our Upper Third dance club were second to join,

learning some of the basics of Cunningham contemporary technique, followed by a choreography workshop where they created beautiful work inspired by their own names.

After a lunchtime of rehearsing for our upcoming showcase, our GCSE and A Level dancers had a challenging technique class involving some very tricky balances and tilts. They then worked to create short pieces inspired by Royal Ballet choreographer

(and one of Mrs Barber's favourites-a fellow Stopfordian!) Wayne McGregor. Sophie was extremely impressed with the quality and originality of their work! We then had a question and answer session with Sophie, with her giving our aspiring performers useful advice on the best places to train and how to look after themselves whilst dancing. Sophie not only dances with professional dance companies, but also teaches on The Lowry CAT scheme, where gifted dancers can further their training in contemporary dance. There are also lots of opportunities for students on this scheme to work with professional companies and see shows for free!
