Karate Club

I am delighted to be able to confirm that we are now in a position to restart our weekly Karate sessions on Monday morning for pupils in all year groups. This will begin on Monday 27 September.

The sessions will take place in the school sports hall under the guidance of Mr Ian Gillis a 5th Dan Blackbelt Karate instructor. Mr Gillis is a former national champion and he has strong links with Team GB Karate/GB Taekwondo.



The pupils will be learning Traditional Shotokan Karate, which is one of the most widely practiced styles of karate in the world. The sessions are inclusive of all abilities and all pupils are welcome to attend, regardless of their karate experience level.

The sessions will be no contact in the first instance. After a four week trial period, students will be required to purchase an annual Karate license at a cost of £25 per year.

This includes the UK Government, who have established a 25-year plan setting out what they will do to improve the environment. To further raise environmental awareness, days such as World Earth Day and World Oceans Day are celebrated.

STEM Curriculum

The Prep STEM curriculum has started with a roar! The children have loved their topics this term; in Prep One the children have been on the hunt for dinosaurs, tracking their footprints around the school. Prep Two have been investigating habitats

and discussing whether the items that found were 'Alive', 'Dead' or had 'Never Lived'. Prep 5 have taken on the STEM Paper Tower Challenge, seeing which group could build the tallest tower using only paper, Sellotape, and paper clips. The tower had to be able to stand of its own accord.

Each of the tasks the children have undertaken help them improve on their teamwork and communication skills, it challenges them with higher order thinking and reasoning; 'Why has this never been alive?', 'How big could the creature that















created this footprint be?', 'What is needed to ensure the tower stays upright?'.

The children really enjoy these challenges and working together to achieve a common goal.

Prep 6 - Hit The Stage

Prep 6 are so happy to be starting rehearsals for their Year 6 production. They are excited to know that this year they will be presenting a live 'On Stage' performance to parents, family and friends as well as the whole of the Prep School. 
