We have finished off the term with a series of Celebration Assemblies where we have rewarded our hard working students with a selection box and a headteacher certificate of commendation. Well done to all!






## Carols by Candlelight

### **Medical Forum Careers Event**

Over 40 pupils from the U4-U6 attended the Medical Forum Careers event on Monday 13 December. They heard from three guest speakers...

- Dr Jacqui Joyce-O'Keeffe spoke on her experiences of working in emergency medicine after qualifying initially as a dentist. She showed how her work can range from the comic to the tragic as well as taking place inside and outside a hospital
- Trainee GP Dr Sana Arif shared her career journey highlighting how medicine offers a range of flexible pathways - and indeed offers flexible working.
- Sarah Kennedy talked about her work as a nurse and lecturer in social care and the importance of bringing a good quality of life to those with learning disabilities.

All three speakers highlighted the wide range of potential healthcare careers beyond those that people see - and how they all work together to produce better outcomes for patients. Students who are interested in any healthcare career can research these on the College Unifrog careers platform.

Dr Joyce-O'Keeffe also stayed after the session to help our Sixth Form medicine applicants practise for interviews - part of the assistance the Medical Forum provides to all those looking for work in this area.







## Stan Horn Visits St Bede's College

Stan Horne, Manchester City's first black footballer, visited St Bede's College last week to meet the pupils who had written letters to him as part of the Premier League's Trailblazers Project. Stan, who was accompanied by his son Matthew and partner Ethel, had a tour of the school with Mr Woan before meeting the Upper Fourth Academy squad in the Vaughan Library. Each pupil spoke to Stan and his family to explain their sporting career so far and also discussed their own family heritage, as pupils within the group have family links to Nigeria, Cameroon, Zimbabwe, Portugal, Spain, China and Congo to name a few.

The boys then asked Stan questions to find out what playing football in the late 1960s and early 1970s must have been like as well as sharing their own education and training schedules. Stan was also presented with a Thank You card signed by all of the pupils and has also offered to return to St Bede's in 2022 to meet more students.


U13's ESFA SS CUP Wetherby 1 - 5 St Bede's Five Star Bede's warm fans up! In a game played in the bitter cold and


