Virtue of the month:


Truthfulness



Trip to Blue Planet Aquarium

On Thursday 11th May Reception Class, Prep One and Prep Two enjoyed a fabulous day out at the Blue Planet Aquarium. This was part of our learning linked to the Topic work on Animals (Rec), Under The Sea (P1) and Habitats (P2). The trip included a classroom session where children were able to participate in a range of activities including;

- Finding out why turtles have shells, how many brains octopuses have, how many eyes starfish have, and more.
- Learning to identify and classify marine life.
- Learning to highlight the differences between marine creatures and other animals.
- Playing with toy sea-creatures and explore how they have adapted to their deep-sea environment.

Alongside this, we also had the opportunity to explore the many exhibits and the famous underwater shark tunnel! This was an exciting opportunity for the children to have first-hand experience with some fascinating creatures. They especially enjoyed watching the divers feeding the stingrays. We even managed to find the elusive tarantula located within the Venom exhibit!

St Bede's has been represented in Manchester City's Premier League winning campaigns at U16, U18 and first team levels. The U16s won the Premier League Cup final on 25 April with a team full of St Bede's U5s and U5s students and a last minute goal to take the title 2-1 against Liverpool.

The sound of the siren and the pitch darkness when the lights went off did not dent the Dunkirk Spirit and the children really did 'Keep Calm and Carry On.'
