



Online Gaming and Online Safety

I hope everyone had a lovely Christmas break and enjoyed spending quality time together as a family. As well as Stanley cups, Barbies and Lego, always popular as gifts at Christmas are new games consoles, so it seems appropriate to remind parents of the importance of prioritising online safety for our children.

Encourage open communication with your children about the potential risks associated with online gaming and staying safe online. By fostering a safe online gaming environment, we can ensure our children enjoy their new consoles while learning responsible digital citizenship.

Remind them never to share personal information, always to use strong passwords, and be cautious when interacting with others online. Pupils often don't realise the dangers of talking to unknown people online in the same way as they would face-to-face.

Use parental controls to create a secure gaming environment and establish reasonable time limits.

The Internet Watch Foundation recommends the TALK acronym to help ensure your children's online safety.

- Talk to your child about online sexual abuse. Start the conversation
- and listen to their concerns.
- **Agree** ground rules about the way you use technology as a family.
- Learn about the platforms and apps your child loves. Take an interest in their online life.
- **Know** how to use tools, apps and settings that can help to keep your child safe online.


Milk Art Experiment




Legally Blonde in cartoon

Annual University and Careers Fair



The Joy Luck Club

This term's Book Club focused on 'The Joy Luck Club' by Amy Tan. Upper Fifth students, who are studying the novel for their English GCSE with Miss Moore and Miss Brown, attended.

The book consists of sixteen interwoven stories about conflicts between Chinese immigrant mothers and their Americanraised daughters. The book hinges on Jingmei's trip to China to meet her half-sisters, twins Chwun Yu and Chwun Hwa. Jing-mei has taken her mother's place playing mahjong in a weekly gathering her mother had organised in China and revived in San Francisco: the Joy Luck Club.

It offers a real insight into Chinese culture. Being in a Western country, like Jing-mei, some students in the discussion shared how they were able to identify with her and what is expected of them in their culture, including Chinese culture. Other themes discussed were tensions that come from high expectations, the relationship between mothers and daughters from different generations, and what could be different if the characters were boys.

It was very interesting to discuss and hear each other's points of views on such crucial topics to our identity.

First three Silver Badge awards of the year






