CHATBOTS AND AI: FRIENDS OR FOES?

Social media has adopted chatbots as a fresh method to capture young users' attention. While the technology itself isn't new, the advanced algorithms behind today's chatbots make them far more effective at holding engagement. They generate replies tailored to the information provided by users, which can create a cycle that strengthens people's existing beliefs. As a result, these systems can spread misinformation, reinforce harmful

decisions, and encourage self-deception.


